Ending Homelessness

Overview

Founded in 1969, Pine Street is the largest provider of permanent supportive housing, emergency shelter, job training and street outreach for homeless men and women in New England.

Pine Street Inn welcomes more than 1,300 homeless individuals daily to provide short- and long-term solutions so that they can begin the journey out of homelessness and on to permanent housing.

Our vision is to help individuals gain stability and their highest level of independence by offering a wide range of services for every person who turns to Pine Street for help.

The following programs are provided at Pine Street:

Permanent Housing: More than 550 individuals live in 29 residences that are either owned or managed by Pine Street. Tenants pay 30 percent of their income toward rent for their room in a supportive environment that keeps them connected to services that help ensure a successful transition to self-sufficiency. Approximately 90 percent of those placed in housing have remained housed.

Shelter and Food: Each night, 650 men and women come in for shelter or are in transitional programs at Pine Street. They are provided with food, clothing, healthcare and case management services.

Street Outreach: Pine Street's outreach teams travel throughout Boston to offer food, blankets, healthcare and referrals to approximately 125 unsheltered men and women. Pine Street is currently the only organization offering outreach in Boston every night.

Job Training: Pine Street provides job training in food services and building maintenance, preparing men and women to re-enter the workforce. Approximately 100 individuals complete these programs each year.
