



Overview

Founded in 1969, Pine Street is the largest provider of permanent supportive housing, emergency shelter, job training and street outreach for homeless men and women in New England.

Pine Street Inn welcomes more than 1,600 homeless individuals daily and 9,000 annually to provide short- and long-term solutions so that they can begin to rebuild their lives.

Our vision is to help individuals gain stability and their highest level of independence by offering a wide range of services for every person who turns to Pine Street for help.

The following programs are provided at Pine Street:

Permanent Housing: Over 850 individuals live in 37 residences throughout Boston and Brookline that are either owned or managed by Pine Street. Tenants pay 30 percent of their income toward rent for their room in a supportive environment that keeps them connected to services that help ensure a successful transition to self-sufficiency. Over 90 percent of those placed in housing have remained housed.

Shelter: Each night, 670 men and women come in for shelter or are in transitional programs at Pine Street. In addition to a bed, they are provided with food, healthcare and case management services.

Street Outreach: Pine Street's outreach teams travel throughout Boston to offer food, blankets, healthcare and referrals to approximately 115 unsheltered men and women. Pine Street is currently the only organization offering outreach in Boston every night.

Job Training & Placement: Pine Street provides job training in food services and building maintenance, preparing men and women to re-enter the workforce. More than 900 men and women each year participate in Pine Street's job workforce development programs
